DOES YOUR DOG JUMP UP ON YOU??

Did you know that jumping up is a 'man-made' behaviour? Yes that's right! When your dog jumps up on you it's because you have taught him to do so. It's what you inadvertently encouraged him to do from when he was a young puppy.

Remember when you would come home from work and you greeted him with such joy and enthusiasm? Remember when you would pick him up and cuddle him...and maybe even kiss him?? And remember when he started to put his paws on your legs for attention and you patted him when he did this? On all of these instances, you were teaching him to jump up to greet you and in some cases even play with you! (Note: I am referring to the dog as 'he'...just for ease of flow and for no other reason!)



But it's not all fun and enjoyment now that he's over 15kgs! And small dogs are not any easier either, what with their sharp nails...OUCH!!

The other thing to note is that every time you say to your dog "Get down" or "Go away" and touch him when he jumps, you are actually reinforcing the jumping! Young children who scream, cry and flap their arms around are also reinforcing the jumping. As far as the dog is concerned, he's getting exactly what he wants from you...A REACTION!

So what to do now that you have Freddie the 45kg German Shepherd with a jumping up habit??

Well firstly you must stop the reinforcing actions coming from you and your family/friends. This means you must completely ignore the dog when he is jumping if possible. Ignoring means you do not look at, touch or talk to the dog...at ALL! Once your dog has calmed down, then cue a Sit or Drop and only when he remains in position is when you you calmly pat him.

If your dog has taken to mouthing/biting when he jumps you'll need a different course of action. Here are a few ways that can help:

- 1. Say "SIT" as soon as your dog starts to approach you. You need to do this before he reaches you. Pat him only if he remains in a sit, if he gets up and jumps up, you must retreat all attention until he sits again. Keep hands away and arms folded.
- 2. Scatter food treats on the floor each time you come through the front door. This will entice his nose to the ground, allowing you time to get inside without him jumping up. This approach also teaches him a new greeting behaviour of 'Go find the treats on the floor whenever mum or dad comes home'. A good one for kids and visitors.
- 3. For extreme heavy duty jumpers who bite hard try a loud sound (whistle or air horn) or even a squirt from a water pistol at the very moment he jumps up. This approach makes the jumping an unpleasant behaviour to exhibit, and it does save your skin from bites and scratches which can be painful. We also highly recommend a behavioural consultation with one of our trainers to assist if your dog has escalated to biting you when he jumps.

Please come and see us if you need further assistance with a dog that constantly jumps up!
